


# \_INTRODUCTION



### **GARDENS BY THE BAY SERIES**

Inspired by my recent visits to Singapore.

An organic deconstruction leads to the purest and most simplified forms of nature. This contemporary expression of lush vegetation, though unlike the dense forests of Patagonia, manages to captivate you for a moment, as if you were in the very heart of the Misiones jungle.

The colorful backgrounds in greenish, pinkish, or bluish tones, with branching elements at the top reminiscent of Eastern symbols, pay homage to the Southeast Asian culture and the environmental commitment of this marvelous city-state—a model of biodiversity where only spontaneity is allowed in the greenery of its parks and the confines of the canvases.

The various hues represented in the vibrant backgrounds of the works, as if reflecting an illuminated night at Gardens by the Bay with its nocturnal light show, play with colors such as vibrant pinks, grayish purples, and other tones to simulate a light spectacle against the white canvas background.

This series will leave no one indifferent, especially to those who have had the opportunity to visit the artificial tree structures housing over 100 different types of plants or any of Singapore's corners

### **SPRINGBREAKS SERIES**

A series of great color and size, which tries to make a wink to the European spring of March 2020 that we could not see.

"The current situation, takes us into the sad world confinements and looking for the abstraction of time, large and colorful flowers emerge as floating in the ocean, which seem to seek a hole in the canvas and thus, to float".

Highlighting in size and shape, vibrant tones with broad pink hues, contrasting with dark and black flowers that seek to capture nefarious protagonism. This struggle of color positioning, represents the contradictory sensation of personal satisfaction, ignoring like the old abstract expressionists, any external social, political or cultural event.

The deep immersion in a subconscious, without time, without minutes, without days, led me to generate the freest, most uncontrollable and large works, meters and meters, which only represented the pleasure and enjoyment of the artistic movement.

### PEACE AT ITS HIGHEST TENSION

Ingrid Haubrich's works make a great visual impact. The way she fills the space, brings together and swirls color, lets us see all that she has to say from the dramatic tension she creates in the image. The stormy chiaroscuro and the open forms that appear like tongues, seem to drag the viewer into a turbulent interior. How can our artist possess such a g raceful, proportionate and harmonious figure and at the same time contain such impulsive rushes? Ingrid does not deceive, if she deceivesherself. All this disappears as she paints.

This new series, entitled "Tides" ("Mareas"), alludes to the Alternating and periodical movement of ascent and descent that, like the sea, also occurs in the consciousness of people. In his painting, there is agitation both what tries to come out, as well as what remainsin the background.

"I would like the viewer of my works to find the same tranquility and harmony that I find the same tranquility and harmony that painting them gives me". For Ingrid, impetuosity is in life, no in art. Thus, she seeks that each painting to be the imprint of a n energy to live."

Painting gives me peace," she says. For this reason it is a finding that the work is exhibited in a center of spirituality. The blues associated with the celestial testify to this.
